Good morning mike,

This is a bit of a tricky one!

Basically, if the vehicle is road legal- lights, registration plates etc, then the vehicle is allowed on road. If the registration plate is obscured by mud- (which most of them are, as they are generally farm vehicles) then there is an offence, but there would be a degree of discretion, as if it is fresh mud, it would be difficult to prove the offence, & we have to be realistic in how we deal with it.

As regards passengers, that depends on the insurance, & most quad bikes are built with a double seat, to enable carriage of a passenger.

I know there have been issues regarding firearms, but as long as it is carried within a "sleeve", then again there are no offences.

If you genuinely think there are blatant offences, then report, and/or take photographs, but you must understand that it would not be considered a "priority" call.
