I hope this might remind everyone to be vigilant about your outside buildings and sheds. Try to make it as difficult as possible for anyone to get into them. Small alarms on the door, is always a good deterrent. Make sure your power tools are marked clearly with your postcode.

If you happen to see any suspicious vehicles please call 101 with a registration number and any description such as make model and colour.

Now the Prime Minister has reopened up pubs and campsites we have a lot more vehicles back on the roads, it was so peaceful during lockdown! You will be pleased to know that we can now start to get our SpeedWatch volunteer scheme trained and ready to start monitoring the traffic.

We have been patrolling the Quantocks. We came across a fly tipper getting rid of rubble at Sandy beds. We asked him to put it back into his vehicle and dispose of it properly. We reported this to Sedgemoor council and they decided that as the male was compliant and had politely took the rubble away, they would not fine him this time, but he did receive a strongly worded letter.

If you ever see anyone fly tipping always, get a registration of the vehicle, or even a photo. This can be then reported to the council and the offender will be given a very large fine.
